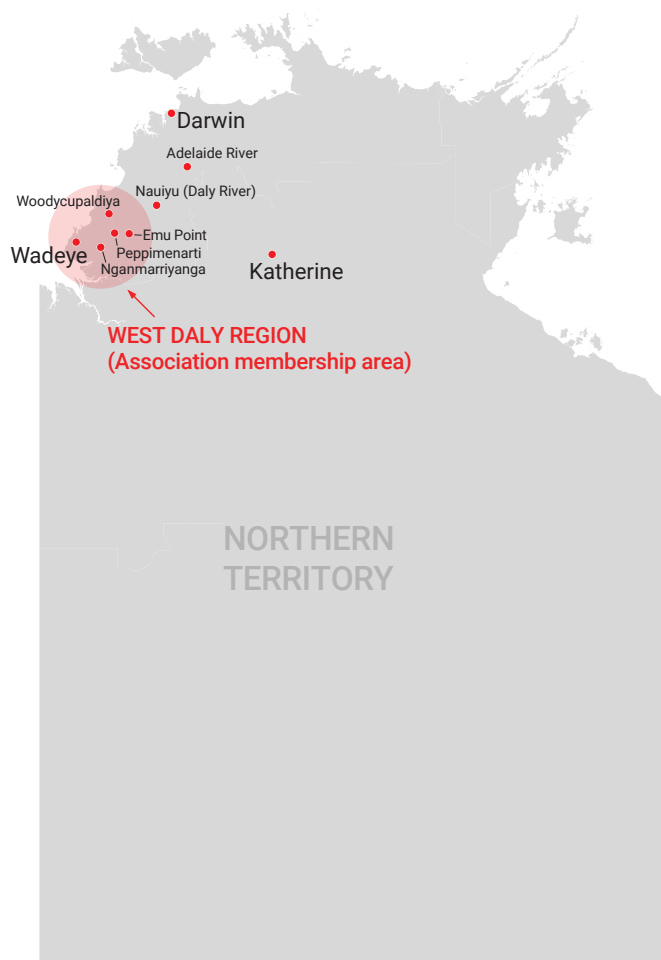

Murin was established through the local Catholic Mission in 1972 when the elders of Wadeye community banded together to contribute a phenomenal \$10,000 of their own funds to continue the operation of an air service into Wadeye.

Since then, Murin has continued to provide passenger and freight services to the Wadeye community for over 40 years. We are proud to have seen growth, allowing us to expand our operations to include increased flight and freight schedules, as well as other service offerings to meet the ever-growing needs of the Wadeye community and the broader Daly region.

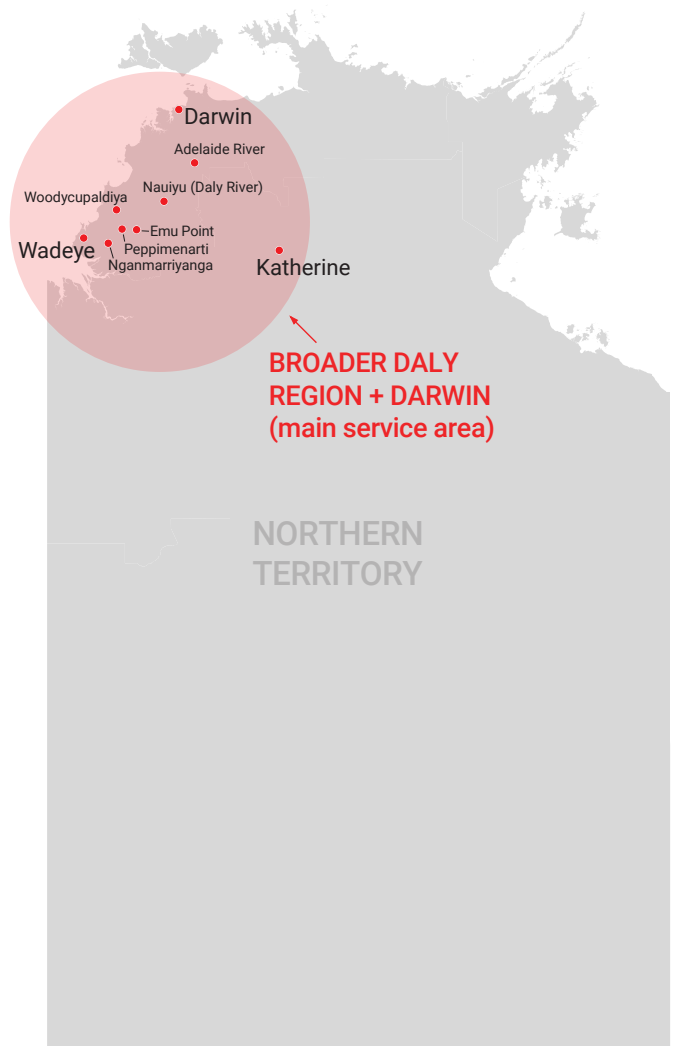

The diversity and flexibility of our services, as well as our extensive understanding of regional context, allows us to support the communities and people of the Daly region in a meaningful way by offering place-based approaches and solutions. This involves planning and adapting our services based on the needs of the community and, where possible, engaging the residents of the community as active participants in development and implementation.

CIVIL SERVICE

Murin Civil specialises in a range of remote civil works, including:

- Bulk earthworks, pavements and stormwater installations
- Road and airstrip infrastructure upgrades
- Drainage infrastructure
- Construction of drilling pads, ponds and housing pads

We deliver projects independently and also have partnership arrangements with other contractors across the Northern Territory, which allow Murin Civil to scale up operations as required for larger projects.

AIR SERVICE

Murin holds a long-standing service agreement with Darwin based aircraft operator Hardy Aviation. In partnership with Hardy Aviation, we offer all year regular air services along with private charters to the Daly region and throughout Northern Australia.

Murin has modern terminal and passenger facilities at Marrara (Darwin General Aviation) and at Port Keats Airfield (Wadeye), providing airconditioned passenger waiting rooms, luggage storage, and customer service and booking facilities.

The regular flight schedule between Darwin and Port Keats Airfield (Wadeye) operates on aircrafts that range from 7 seater to 19 seater Twin Engine configurations.

As part of our air and freight services, Murin provides year round mail services throughout the Daly region through contracts with Australia Post. The mail delivery service is essential for the livelihoods of people living in the remote communities we service, enabling the connection of often isolated communities with the rest of the Northern Territory and Australia.



BUS SERVICE

Murin offers all year regular bus passenger services from Darwin to the Daly region.

Our bus service offers passenger transport to the Daly region and its surrounding communities with services available to Adelaide River, Batchelor, Daly River (Nauiyu), Wudikupildiyerr, Emu Point, Peppimenarti, Palumpa, and Wadeye.

FREIGHT SERVICE

Murin Freight operates a weekly dry season freight service that delivers freight to the Daly region, including Daly River (Nauiyu), Emu Point, Peppimenarti, Palumpa, and Wadeye.

A range of organisations regularly engage Murin's freight services, including Thamarrurr Development Corporation, Toll, West Daly Regional Council, Eni Australia Limited, Federal and Territory Government departments and a number of other community businesses in the Daly region.

During the wet season, Murin offers a weekly roll on roll off barge service to the Daly region via Wadeye, catering for perishable and dry food goods, building materials, fuel, machinery and equipment. Murin also offers barge charters for Northern Territory coastal communities through our service agreement with operator Auriga Logistics.

Services we offer under our freight arm include:

- **General Freight:** We can transport everyday household items, personal packages, gifts and more.
- **Refrigerated items:** We can deliver ambient, frozen or cold goods to their final destination intact with our refrigerated service.
- **Plant and Equipment:** From small machinery such as generators and forklifts to large industrial equipment, we can help transport items to their required destination.
- **Building materials:** We can transport raw materials for construction projects.
- **Medical supplies:** We deliver medical supplies to remote communities and homelands through contracts with NT Government Health Department, the National Disability Insurance Scheme and aged care service providers.

ADMINISTRATION AND HOMELANDS SERVICE

Murin provides a range of administrative services across the Daly region to allow local and regional businesses to focus on their core operations and support social and economic outcomes for communities and homelands. Services we offer under a fee for service arrangement include:

- **Bookkeeping:** We provide bookkeeping services for businesses operating in the Daly region to support sustainable operations and capability and capacity building.
- **Homelands services:** We deliver a range of services to homelands across the Daly region, including housing maintenance and municipal and essential services.
- **Project management:** We provide project management services to support the implementation of large capital projects across the Daly region.
- **Grant submission and management:** We lead the submission and subsequent implementation and management of grants across the Daly region that have a focus on social and economic outcomes for communities and homelands.

CIVIL

Project: Manthape Subdivision Civil Works and Services Construction

Client: NT Department of Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics

Contract value: \$5.7m

Location: Wadeye

Scope: Practical construction of a 30 lot residential subdivision in Wadeye including roads, stormwater drainage, allotment grading, water, sewer and electrical services.

As part of this project, pre-employment training was delivered in Darwin for seven Indigenous Murin team members from Wadeye and the West Daly region.

Project: Port Keats Road Maintenance from Wadeye to Emu Point

Client: NT Department of Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics – Transport and Civil Services

Contract value: \$1.1m

Location: Wadeye and Emu Point

Scope: Ongoing maintenance grading and road repairs to the Port Keats Road from Wadeye turn off to Emu Point turn off for a period of 36 months from October 2019 until September 2022.

Murin has maintained an 87% Indigenous workforce over the duration of the works. Works are still ongoing under a contract extension.

Project: West Daly Roadworks

Client: West Daly Regional Council

Contract value: \$900k

Location: West Daly region

Scope: Practical completion of various road upgrade works at Port Keats, Merrrepen/Nemarluk, Peppimenarti and Emu Point.

Only local contractors and subcontractors were engaged by Murin to deliver the works. Murin had an Indigenous participation rate of 35%, which included the training and upskilling of 10 Aboriginal participants from the West Daly region.

Project: Emu Point Housing Upgrade Project

Client: NT Department of Territory Families, Housing and Communities

Contract value: \$1.7m

Location: Emu Point

Scope: Upgrades, repairs and maintenance to Emu Point Powerstation including the supply and install of a 200Kva generator to better support the community load.

Full renovations to three semi-elevated houses at Emu Point to bring them back to a reasonable standard in line with the Nine Healthy Living Practices.



OTHER

Project: Emergency Project – Electrical Repairs

Client: NT Department of Territory Families, Housing and Communities

Contract value: \$85k

Location: Woodycupaldiya and Emu Point

Scope: Urgent electrical repairs to dwellings in Woodycupaldiya and Emu Point homelands. This included installing new and/or upgrades to switchboards, earthing systems, smoke alarms and electrical hardware within the specified houses to ensure they were safe and compliant and to improve power security.

Project: Tree management and urgent house repairs

Client: NT Department of Territory Families, Housing and Communities

Contract value: \$260k

Location: Woodycupaldiya

Scope: Essential tree management works surrounding dwellings, power lines and infrastructure in Woodycupaldiya.

This project reduced the risk of serious harm within the homeland by conducting tree management works where there was a hazard to houses and nearby power lines, as well as improving the health and safety of residents by undertaking urgent housing repairs.



Project: Municipal and Essential Services, Housing Maintenance Services and Homelands Jobs

Client: NT Department of Territory Families, Housing and Communities

Contract value: \$610k

Location: Woodycupaldiya, Emu Point, Djudian and Leichardt

Scope: Service provision for Woodycupaldiya, Emu Point, Djudian and Leichardt homelands.

Funding was awarded over the 2022 and 2023 financial years and includes municipal and essential services, housing maintenance services and homelands jobs. This project currently supports three part time Indigenous employees at Emu Point and two part time Indigenous employees at Woodycupaldiya.

Project: Emu Point Crèche

Client: NT Department of Education

Location: Emu Point

Scope: Murin managed the crèche at Emu Point outstation, which provides early childcare services to the community. The crèche supports the employment of five local Indigenous employees from Emu Point outstation.

Murin continues to support the local corporation, Mulyung Aboriginal Corporation, to build its capacity and capability through mentoring and other support as required to enable them to take over the management of the crèche in the future.

Project: Homelands Emergency Capital Program

Client: NT Department of Territory Families, Housing and Communities

Contract value: \$59k

Location: Woodycupaldiya

Scope: Urgent delivery of food and fuel supplies to Woodycupaldiya homeland who had been cut off due to major flooding.

Under its Constitution, the organisation’s membership and Executive Committee comprises only of Aboriginal people from Wadeye and surrounding areas.

Murin has a strong management team who ensure continuous improvement and growth for the organisation, focussing on a sustainable model and outcomes that are in line with our mission to increase the quality of life of the people residing in the Wadeye community and surrounding areas.

COMMITMENT TO ABORIGINAL EMPLOYMENT AND PARTICIPATION

Murin has a strong commitment to Aboriginal participation in employment across our business. Not only is this evidenced through the work we do, but it is also embedded in our internal operations.

Murin employs 33 people across our different service areas. Of our 33 employees, we are proud that 60% are of Aboriginal descent, with 85% of our Aboriginal employees coming from the West Daly region.

TRAINING AND UPSKILLING

Murin is committed to providing quality training and upskilling to employees as part of its operations and project delivery, focussing on engaging Indigenous people of the West Daly region in meaningful employment.



As part of our day to day operations and through tailored programs to support the delivery of specific projects, Murin focusses on the following areas to support the training and upskilling of our employees:

- **Employment pathways:** We support Indigenous jobseekers into suitable and sustainable jobs and traineeships.
- **Mentoring:** We provide ongoing structured mentoring support that empowers and builds community capacity and capability.
- **Community engagement:** We actively work with local Indigenous communities across our region and partner with the community to create opportunities for its residents.
- **Personal development:** We develop life skills, cross-cultural awareness and ensure all Indigenous employees have the best chance of success in their role.

Project: Port Keats Road Maintenance from Wadeye to Emu Point

Location: Darwin

Scope: As part of the Port Keats Road maintenance project, Murin supported four Indigenous employees from the West Daly region to successfully complete the following nationally accredited training in Darwin:

- Implement Traffic Management Plan (RIIWH302E)
- Control Traffic with a Stop-Slow bat (RIIWH205E)



Project: Manthape Subdivision

Location: Darwin

Scope: As part of the Manthape Subdivision project, Murin held Stage 1 Pre-Employment training in Darwin for seven participants from the Wadeye and the broader West Daly region. The pre-employment training was held over five days and focused on the individuals, their goals and aspirations and what is required to achieve them. Participants also completed the below nationally accredited training:

- White Card (CPCCWHS1001)
- Work Safely and Follow WHS Policies and Procedures (RIIWH201E)



Project: Civil Training Program

Location: Emu Point outstation

Scope: Murin, in partnership with the Department of Industry, Tourism and Trade, provided a Civil Training Program at Emu Point outstation in 2020. The following accredited training modules were delivered through RTO Carey Training as part of the Training Program:

- RIIMP0320F – Conduct civil construction excavator operations (200AHC)
- RIIMP0317F – Conduct civil roller operations (80AHC)

A total of seven Aboriginal people attended the Training Program, with 100% of participants successfully completing the excavator and roller operations training and receiving their nationally recognised qualifications.
